


From the Desk of Fr. Ken

PODCAST REVIEW



THE CATECHIST'S CORNER

The Ask Christopher West Podcast Hosted by Christopher and Wendy West

It's a line we can so often miss in the creed, especially as it appears amidst a list of other key beliefs in the Catholic faith. "I believe in...the resurrection of the body." As we continue to celebrate this season of Easter, we consistently revisit this reality of our Lord's victory over death week by week. This victory that is so complete and powerful that the body which was once bruised, bloodied, and broken is now restored and transformed to reveal the glory of Christ's sacrifice even through the persistence of the wounds of His crucifixion.

God's true omnipotence is indeed fully revealed! But there are two more points that we can come to appreciate about this reality of Christ's resurrection. First, this piece in God's plan of salvation history gives us great hope that we, too, as followers of Christ, can come to experience new life with Him after death in a way that doesn't just involve our souls but our bodies. Our faith pushes back against the Gnostic suggestions of the world that believe our bodies are temporary vessels and proclaims that they, being a part of us, will share in the glory of Heaven. And second, and following this logic of the first point, we can then see that our Lord, through His Resurrection, evidences the great dignity of the physical body and its key role in revealing God's love for His creation. Christopher West, through his weekly podcast, highlights the manifold implications of these and many other components of John Paul II's Theology of the Body and helps each listener to embrace their fully integrated identity as a "beloved, irreplaceable, unrepeatable" gift from God. I cannot say enough about the honest vulnerability of Christopher and his wife, Wendy, who answer a handful of submitted questions each episode from both a theological and experiential lens. These range from inquiries related to pursuing chastity in courtship and marriage, navigating conversations related to gender identity or same-sex attraction, and understanding the Church's most complex and difficult teachings. Whether you are single, engaged, married, a parent, or are actively discerning a religious vocation, I guarantee you will find Christopher and Wendy to be great friends to converse with during your daily commute or Saturday cleaning routine! *(Reviewed by Haley Metzger)*



Frequently asked questions...

WHERE

The pilgrims will start their journey in Brownsville on the Juan Diego Route, San Francisco on the Serra Route, Lake Itasca on the Marian Route, and New Haven on the Seton Route. Their travels will take them through parishes across the country to engage local communities in encounters with Our Lord. Then, at the National Eucharistic Congress in July 2024 in Indianapolis, we will gather as one to encounter the living Jesus Christ, be transformed by his presence, and be sent out on mission to share the good news of his love.

WHEN

There will be kickoff events for the pilgrimages on Saturday, May 18th, 2024, in each of the four starting cities ahead of the celebration of Pentecost Sunday. The next morning, following Mass, there will be processions with local parishioners to start the pilgrims on their pilgrimage. They will then walk across the country until they reach Indianapolis for the Congress in July 2024.


PERPETUAL PILGRIMS

A select number of young adult Catholics will serve as "Perpetual Pilgrims," traveling together with the Blessed Sacrament and accompanied by Priest Chaplains for the entire two months of each route from the Pentecost kickoff to the culmination of the Pilgrimage in Indianapolis. They will receive biblical hospitality throughout, hosted by lay families, parishes, religious orders, schools, and shrines along the way.

HOW TO PARTICIPATE

Parishes along the routes will be invited to pray and worship with the pilgrims. **Our Eastside Family will be hosting events at each of our churches when the pilgrimage passes through Madisonville, Oakley, and Hyde Park on July 5th and July 6th. Stay tuned for more details on this in the coming weeks!**

The National Eucharistic Pilgrimage is desired to be a fire starter for pilgrimages around the country, starting with the kick-off of the Year of Parish Revival in June 2023. Find these resources and more on our website (launching May 2023).


