



The Exaltation of the True Cross

This Sunday, September 14, is the feast of the Exaltation of the Cross, which commemorates the discovery of the True Cross by St. Helena. Many saints have written that the suffering of Jesus on the cross brought them into a deeper devotion to the faith. St. Rose of Lima has a famous quote: "Apart from the cross there is no other ladder by which we may get to heaven." She embraced suffering to bring her closer to Our Lord. The cross isn't a place of defeat, but instead a place of *overcoming* defeat and embracing the victory of salvation. We all face times of suffering. May we go to Our Lord to develop perseverance, hope, and compassion, as we humble ourselves and reflect on Jesus' own suffering on the cross.
