

During Lent, we remember that all we are and all we have is a gift from God. In the busyness of life, we can forget this truth, but cultivating an “attitude of gratitude” transforms the way we experience His loving presence each day.

Living with a grateful heart opens our eyes to blessings, even in hardship, through the care of a doctor, the support of a friend, or unexpected strength in suffering. Gratitude deepens our trust in God’s providence and reveals His abundance in every circumstance.

When gratitude becomes our way of life, we truly live the meaning of the Eucharist, “to give thanks.” Coming to Mass with thankful hearts opens us to the fullness of Christ’s presence. As members of His Body, we gather around the Eucharist table to celebrate our many blessings, above all the gift of Christ’s life, love, and saving grace poured out for us.

Here are simple ways to nurture a spirit of thankfulness:

Begin each day by thanking God for His unfailing love. Look for signs of that love in Scripture, the sacraments, prayer, and the kindness of others. Recognize each new day as a gift. Even in difficult times, seek a small blessing to hold in your heart. Share your gifts generously and notice how your kindness brings light to others. Express gratitude to those who care for you.

Whatever your circumstances, God’s blessings are present. If you are financially secure, thank God and look for ways to share your blessings. If you face challenges, notice the support, generosity, and encouragement that surround you, especially within your parish family.

Within our parish family gratitude grows through shared faith and service. Consider offering your time and talents through parish ministries, community outreach, or service projects. By belonging and serving, you will discover blessings beyond what you imagined.

Reflection: *How are you already living as a grateful and generous steward of God’s gifts? Where is God inviting you to grow? How might you deepen your spirit of gratitude this Lent? With open hearts and thankful spirits, may we continue to grow in faith, generosity, and joyful discipleship.*

Divine Mercy Reflection

In St. Faustina's Diary, Jesus reveals two practical ways we can place our trust in Him. The first way is through simple and honest conversation. Jesus invites us to speak to Him as we would a close friend, sharing the details of our day and what moves our hearts. He tells St. Faustina, "...tell Me about everything that concerns you, even the smallest details...and know that this will give Me great joy...with childlike simplicity talk to Me about everything, for My ears and heart are inclined towards you, and your words are dear to Me" (Diary, 921). Even though Jesus already knows everything about us, He desires to hear our voices. As I recently gazed upon the Divine Mercy image, a question arose in my heart worth pondering: When I ask and tell Jesus something, am I fully trusting that He answers and hears?

The second way we place our trust in Jesus, is through receiving Him reverently and prayerfully in the Eucharist. When we look at the Divine Mercy Image, we see His hand raised in blessing and the rays of grace flowing from His Heart for us. Jesus tells St. Faustina, "Know, My daughter, that when I come to a human heart in Holy Communion, My hands are full of all kinds of graces which I want to give to the soul... Oh, how sad I am that souls do not recognize Love! They treat Me as a dead object" (Diary, 1385).

During this second week of Lent, may we ask Jesus for the graces that transform us and place ourselves in His presence, speaking to Him with trusting hearts. Just as time spent with a good friend can uplift and strengthen us long afterward, time spent in the presence of Jesus changes us much more than the moment at hand. With this we say, "Jesus, I trust in You!"

- **Ages 18-59:** Fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting allows one full meal a day.
- **Ages 14 and up:** Abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all Fridays of Lent.


