

On March 19, the Church honors Saint Joseph, faithful foster father of Jesus, protector of the Holy Family, and patron of workers, fathers, and the island of Sicily. In him we see humble obedience, “he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him” (Matthew 1:24), and through his quiet “yes,” God was given a faithful servant to protect the Savior.

In Italy, especially in Sicily, the feast is celebrated with traditional “Saint Joseph Tables,” created after his intercession during a historic drought. These beautiful, meatless altars feed the poor and honor his charity, echoing: “Whoever is generous to the poor lends to the Lord” (Proverbs 19:17). As we celebrate, may we imitate Saint Joseph’s faith, humility, and trust in God’s providence. With all this in mind, please join us on Thursday, March 19, at 5:30 PM for Mass at St. Mary and then join us in Robisch Hall for a celebration to blessed Saint Joseph.

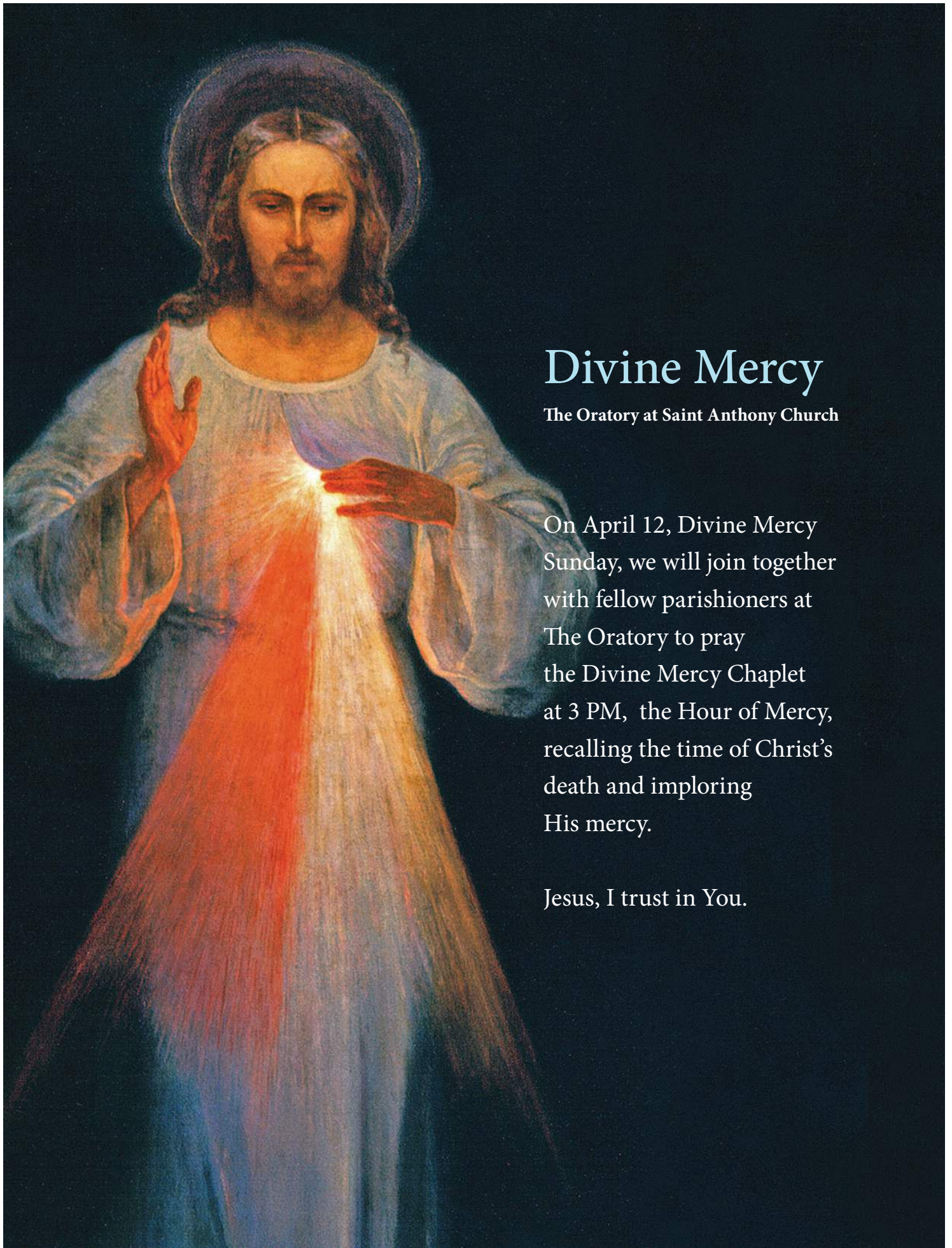

### Divine Mercy Reflection

When looking upon the Divine Mercy image we have to the left of the altar at St. Cecilia, our eyes are almost immediately drawn to the two brilliant rays flowing forth. The heart of Christ is clearly the focal point, and from it pours light that reaches toward us. It is worth pondering the fact that Jesus specifically instructed St. Faustina to find a painter who would paint His image just like this (Diary, 47).

What does that tell us? Perhaps that Jesus first and foremost wants to be known by His mercy where He shines forth to meet us with all kindness and gentleness. We learn that "...The two rays denote Blood and Water. The pale ray stands for the Water which makes souls righteous. The red ray stands for the Blood which is the life of souls..." (Diary, 299). In this way, Jesus wishes to help us live a life aligned with His divine will which will in return arouse in our souls both joy and fullness of life.

One of the best ways we can dwell in the shelter of Jesus' rays of mercy is by making a good Confession this Lent. Jesus tells us, "When you approach the confessional, know this, that I Myself am waiting there for you. I am only hidden by the priest, but I Myself act in your soul...If [your] trust is great, there is no limit to My generosity (Diary, 1602). Through this Sacrament, we are more free to love as we wish—how beautiful! As we gaze upon His Divine Mercy, may we find the courage to step fully into the light streaming from His Heart and say with confidence, "Jesus, I trust in You."

### Fast and Abstinence Guidelines for Lent

- **Ages 18-59:** Fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting allows one full meal a day.
- **Ages 14 and up:** Abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all Fridays of Lent.

### Stations of the Cross during Lent

Every Friday during Lent, we will pray the Stations of the Cross at 9:30 AM and 7 PM at Saint Cecilia Church, and at 5:30 PM at St. Mary. Through meditation and prayer, we will walk with our Savior on his way of suffering from the time he was condemned to death until he died and was buried. Make this devotion part of your Lenten commitment to prayer and grow closer to Christ.

### Seven Church Pilgrimage on Holy Thursday Night

All Eastside Family parishioners are invited to join us for a centuries-long Holy Thursday tradition. 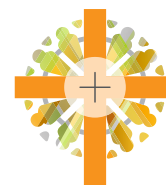
