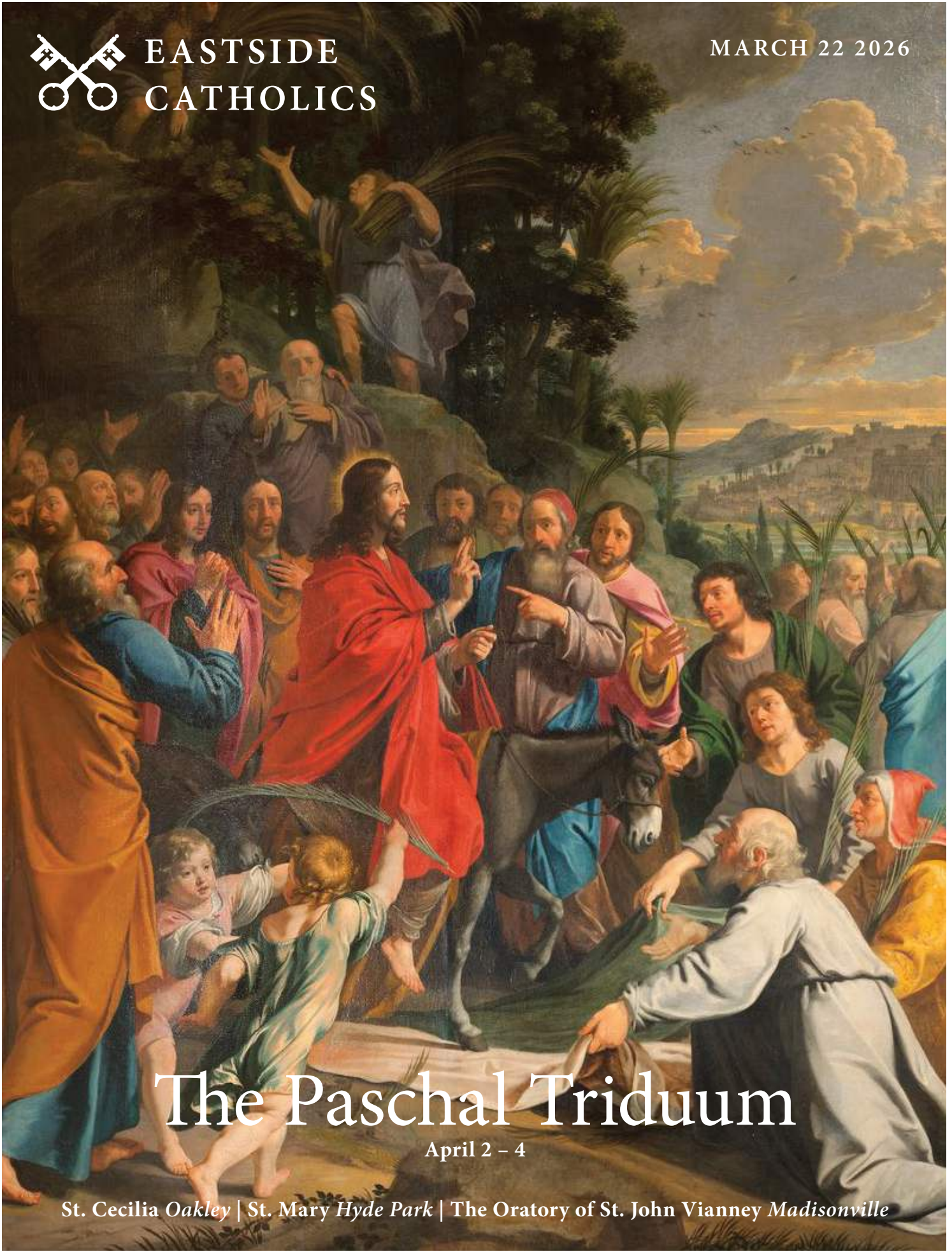

The Paschal Triduum is one week away and it is one of the most important weeks of the year for Catholics. We start off on Sunday, March 29, with Palm Sunday. Jesus is greeted with a triumphant entrance into Jerusalem which begins Holy Week.

The following week is made up of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil. If you can find the time this year it is a wonderful journey to go to each of these Masses and services leading you to Easter.

Holy Thursday is significant because it commemorates the institution of the Eucharist, the Last Supper and the priesthood. We have the holy oils that were blessed at the Chrism Mass brought in by people who received the: Oil of the Sick that is used in Anointing the Sick, the Oil of Catechumens which is used for Baptism and the Holy Chrism which is used in Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Orders.

On Good Friday, we venerate the Cross, pray the Stations of the Cross, and spend time in prayer at the Altar of Repose.

The high point is the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday evening where we welcome the new members of the Church through Baptism and Confirmation. It is the culmination of the Passion and we celebrate the Resurrection of Christ—the victory over sin and death has been won. He is risen!

## Divine Mercy Reflection

The Divine Mercy Chaplet and the words, “for the sake of His sorrowful passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world,” are familiar to many. What is less widely known are the powerful promises Jesus attached to this prayer.

A simple way I was inspired to begin a devotion to Divine Mercy came through this passage: “At three o’clock, implore My mercy, especially for sinners; and, if only for a brief moment, immerse yourself in My Passion, particularly in My abandonment at the moment of agony...I will refuse nothing to the soul that makes a request of Me in virtue of My Passion” (Diary, 1320). Jesus is so generous that even if we simply pause at 3pm, recall His agony, ask for mercy, and bring our needs to Him, He promises to answer our prayer. He confirms this again in another passage: “Through the Chaplet you will obtain everything, if what you ask for is compatible with My will” (Diary, 1731). These are remarkable promises.

Praying the Chaplet, especially in the presence of the dying, carries particular significance. Jesus told St. Faustina, “When they say this chaplet in the presence of the dying, I will stand between My Father and the dying person, not as a just Judge but as a merciful Savior. When hardened sinners say it, I will fill their souls with peace, and the hour of their death will be a happy one” (Diary, 1541).

I once experienced this personally while praying the Chaplet and holding the hand of someone in the hospital who was dying. When I left that evening, I did not know how long she would live. Upon returning the next day, a nurse told me she had died peacefully during the night. I asked, “At what time?” She replied, “3 A.M.” Jesus is faithful to His promises!

This Lent, consider pausing each day at 3 PM to remember Jesus’ great passion for us. Pray for those who have recently died, for the conversion of souls, or for a special intention in your own life. In doing so, you will find your relationship with Jesus growing ever deeper. With this intention in mind we pray: Jesus, we trust in You!

Join us on Divine Mercy Sunday, **April 12**, at 3 PM at the Oratory of St. John Vianney for a special Holy Hour. We will pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet and Litany, a short talk will be given, and there will also be music and time for silent prayer. Mark your calendar and plan some time with Our Eucharistic Lord on this Feast of Divine Mercy!

When the statues are veiled during these final days of Lent, we are better able to keep all of our attention on Jesus and His suffering. The veil is a form of fasting from beautiful things and reminders of heaven. It reminds us of our exile from paradise and is an image of sorrow for sin. It is also symbolic of Jesus' humiliation and of the fact that He hid His divinity during His Passion. We will remove the veils on Holy Saturday as we prepare to enter into the joy of the Vigil Mass of Easter.



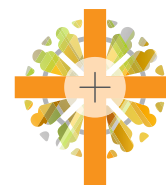
